Board Member Report

Board member, Cathleen Morgan commented on the recent news reports on the District's 2018 School Grades. The district had 52% of its traditional schools earn an "A" or "B" - not including charter schools. The district maintained its B grade for the fifth year in a row.

Sixteen schools improved more than one letter grade. Tice Elementary moved from a "D" to a "B" in one year. It's all about high performance leadership, a common culture and a teacher's commitment to that particular program. Three high schools earned A grades; Fort Myers High, North Fort Myers High, and Estero High. 50 district schools maintained their letter grades and 14 dropped. This year no school received an F grade. Only one school, East Lee County High, received a "D" grade which is being appealed. Last year we had Five "D" Schools that were placed into a differentiated accountability status and this year just one is in DA status. Dr. Adkins said, in four years, we have taken this district from having 23 schools in DA status "differentiated accountability status" down to one and that grade is being appealed. It has been a remarkable achievement for a district this size and with the diverse student population it has. When you look at the top 10 school districts size wise, what you see is that we have made incredible changes over the last couple of years. In my opinion, when Dr. Adkins came in and committed the district to a curriculum that is student driven and then set the time and training to implement that curriculum and resources, we can see that we have started to turn around something that has been a disaster since Larry Tihen's generation of administrators retired. We were an "A" district when Tihen was here. Then we went through five years where the guts of the organization were ripped out academically. Now with quality leadership and good people in the right places, who know what they are doing, who share a vision and commit their respective resources to that vision, we've been able to accomplish real growth. I think that in three years we're realistically seeing that there has been a change and we expect to see something positive.
