LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

- In a webinar with FDOE on February 13, we learned that the math textbook adoption for 2018-2019 will be suspended due to the Executive Order by Governor DeSantis mandating a review and revision of our current standards.
- This means Lee County, along with every other Florida district, will not be moving forward with the math textbook adoption as planned.
- As we prepare for the FY20 budget, we will be assessing the need for materials and reviewing current contracts in preparation for the postponement of the adoption of ELA and Math textbooks.

NEW TIMELINE FOR ADOPTIONS

2019-2020	World Languages and CTE
2020-2021	English Language Arts
2021-2022	Mathematics
2022-2023	Social Studies
2023-2024	Science

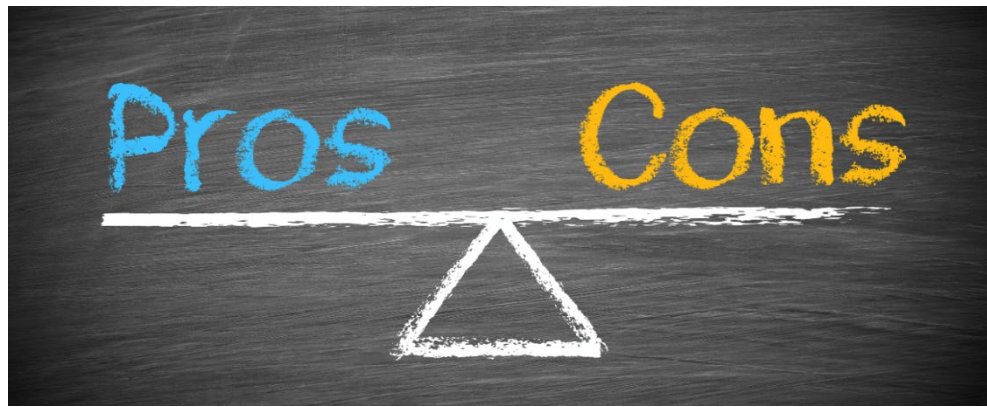
*FSA will remain the same for the next two years. The plan outlines that new standards will be brought to Legislators January 2020 for approval at the end of the legislative session in April 2020.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS



Three Options:

- Move forward with recommendations from Math Textbook Adoption Committees (new resources)
 - Up to 50% of State Textbook Adoption Funding can be used on off textbook adoption materials.
- Maintain our current materials through the gap years
 - 100% of funds from the State Textbook Adoption Funding can be utilized
- Maintain our current materials through the gap years and add supplemental resources
 - Supplements not on the state's short list will be subject to 50% rule for funding

WORK IN PROGRESS

- McGraw Hill will not be printing 2019 updates which takes AGA off the table for adoption.
- Negotiating prices and packages from new vendors and existing vendors to determine purchase prices for new resources or gap year resources.
- Conversations with department chairs, principals and Curriculum Advisory Committee to request input.
